God's mercy is revealed.



READER 2: Christ, through your Bread you offer the remedy for immortality and the pledge of future resurrection; restore health to the sick and living hope to sinners.

All: Christ, the Bread of heaven, grant us everlasting life.

READER 2: Christ, our king who is to come, you commanded that the mysteries which proclaim your death be celebrated until you return; grant that all who die in you may share in your resurrection.

All: Christ, the Bread of heaven, grant us everlasting life.

READER 2: O God, Francis and Clare had great awe and reverence for the Eucharist; may our devotion to Jesus' Body and Blood be an example to those who aspire to the Franciscan life.
